We are part of a vibrant City full of cultural opportunities and we aim for this to form part of the curriculum and extracurricular opportunities we provide.

We work with other schools and organisations in the City and beyond to provide stimulating experiences for the girls and to make use of external venues to share the work we do.

CITY IS FULL OF MUSIC...



We have opportunities for all girls to indulge their musical pursuits including an array of orchestras, choirs and ensembles. We develop our advanced musicians and Music Scholars through workshops in Alexander Technique, masterclass opportunities, and Chamber Music and by offering opportunities to contribute to events in and out of CLSG. We have extensive partnerships with organisations in the City, the Livery Companies and other schools and enjoy recognition for the strength of our musical offerings.

We offer an engaging curriculum for girls from Years 3 to 13, including a one-year IGCSE option in addition to the usual two-year route. Music continues to be a popular option at GCSE and A-level and results are consistently high.

Next year we have an exciting year ahead of events, continuing some long serving traditions but also continuing some more recent traditions too. We have expanded our events connected with the curriculum, and events that involve collaboration with other City schools but also with other organisations in the City. Next year is particularly busy with over 70 events in the Music calendar. Charlotte Brosnan will continue as our Visiting Choral Director, and we will also have visits from our first Associate Composer Dr David Knotts. We have a new viola/violin teacher Geoffrey Irwin and cinging teachers Lucy Goddard and Kylie Wyatt joining us in September. Jonathan Taylor joins us in April 2018 as our Jazz/Popular piano teacher.

We look forward to seeing you at our events, and supporting the wonderful music-making of the girls.

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Girls joining the school in Year 7 will have a host of opportunities for them to get involved in the musical life of City. Many opportunities exist for Year 7 and some of the bigger opportunities are mentioned below.

CHOIR AND ORCHESTRA

Junior Choir and Junior Orchestra are ideal for Year 7s who are joining the school. Choir is open to all girls in Year 7 without audition, and in addition to the orchestra Synchronicity offers girls chance to develop their ensemble skills with contrasting repertoire to the orchestra. For the advanced players Senior Orchestra and string ensemble provide a chance to play challenging repertoire, and other large ensembles and choirs include Senior Choir, Swing Band and Jazz Ensemble. Speak to Dr Berryman about choirs and Miss Murphy about orchestras.

All of Year 7 are involved in the spring term concert. As well as the whole year group performing as a choir each form prepares a musical item, as well as contributions from individuals and smaller ensembles. It is a lovely event, and fantastic to see all of the year group performing.

YEAR 7 MUSIC DAY

In collaboration with the Museum of London, the whole year group explores a recent exhibition and devises music in response to it. The girls work in small groups, led by a member of the Music department as they prepare for a performance at the end of the day. Previous exhibitions have included the Fire of London and more recently City Now, City Future.

The Music/Art/Drama project ends the musical year for Year 7. All girls are involved, and working in their forms they devise a performance based on a theme that changes each year. The performance takes the form of a play, with music selected and devised by the girls and all props and artistic elements also created by members of the form. Previous themes have included 'London' and 'Diversity'. Forms work on the project in their music classes during the summer term, culminating in the performance at the end of the year.

Past performances have shown how creative the girls can be when working on this independent project. A visiting adjudicator watches the performances and selects winners of different categories and an overall winner.

Past adjudicators have included Kim Waldock from Royal Opera House, and Sean Gregory from Barbican/ Guildhall School

We extend the curriculum by visits to concerts and with trips to learn about different musical cultures. Recent trips have included visits to the LSO St. Luke's gamelan, the Bhavan Centre in West Kensington to learn about Indian Music.

We have regular visits from musicians, recently Kerry Andrew gave a composition workshop and members of the education team at Steinberg delivered a workshop on recording with Cubase.

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PARTNERSHIPS

There are a range of City Schools events for the new academic year that allow CLSG girls to work with students drawn from across the City family of schools and to work with leading arts organisations in the City.

VCM Young Leaders – working with VCM Foundation, students drawn from all the City Schools will develop workshop leading skills over two terms before visiting a City primary school to work with Apollo5 delivering workshops. Suitable for any student Year 9 and above keen to work on their leading skills.

GSMD Audiences Project – for Year 10 students drawn from City schools who will curate a concert working with an ensemble from Guildhall School. Over the course of a term, the team of students will explore how to put together a classical concert and present the event at the Gresham Centre in December.

LSO Orchestral Day – for Years 6 to 9 from City Schools, will come together at CLSG to work on some orchestral music and give a concert at the end of the day.

With the City of London Sinfonia we will host a String Orchestra workshop for advanced players of Grade 5+, from any City School. The workshop will end with an informal performance open to parents and members of the schools

The City Schools Concert will take place at Milton Court in January 2018, involving performances from all City schools and ending with a devised finale led by Paul Griffiths from Guildhall School. The past two events have been very exciting and have showcased the wonderful music-making that is happening in the City family of schools.



SUPPORTING LIVERIES AND CHARITIES

of City Livery companies, and we are privileged to be invited to perform for their events across the year. We have regular engagements with the Ironmongers, Innholders and Poulters and past performances have taken place at Livery Halls and the House of Lords.

This autumn we support Bowel Cance UK and StreetChild by performing at their Carol Services in December. We will also have girls performing at a charity event for the City of London Police Charity.

An ongoing connection with The Bach Choir sees City girls forming part of the ripieno chorus in the annual performance of St. Matthew Passion at the Royal Festival Hall, South Bank. This is a very special concert, and we are keen for able singers to take part to continue this fantastic tradition.

Singers from City Girls enjoy working with a number of other choirs and recently have worked with the Crouch End Festival Chorus for performances of the Barbican Centre.

LUNCHTIME CONCERTS

Our Lunchtime Concerts series at St. Giles' Cripplegate is a major part of our concert calendar. We have over ten concerts at the church over the year, and it is an exciting opportunity for girls to perform in the wonderful acoustic. We have a range of concerts open to all girls and some themed concerts including Music Theatre, Contemporary Music, Early Music, Piano Duets and Strings.

LEARNING THE ORGAN

The Director of Music at St. Giles' is also our organ teacher. Over the past year we have seen an increased interest in learning the organ by City girls. We are fortunate to be next door to St. Giles' Cripplegate, where the Director of Music Anne Marsden Thomas MBE is internationally renowned for her education work, most notably in founding an Organ School that is now part of the Royal College of Organists. Currently four girls are learning the organ at City, and most notably is recent leaver Aine Kennedy who is the first City girl to be awarded an Organ Scholarship (to Keble College, Oxford) for September 2017.

On learning the organ, Anne says the reason the organ attracts academically bright students is because of "the discipline that learning the organ requires – a good number of professional conductors have been organ scholars at universities. As well as playing the organ so many skills are involved managing the choir, the clergy team, tours. There are six centuries of repertoire for the organ, much more than other instruments as well as the possibility of playing orchestral transcriptions"

To encourage girls to consider the organ, and to facilitate the ability to practice the Larkin Trust kindly supported the acquisition of practice organ for the Music Department. The organ, from Viscount Organs who also supplied instruments to the Guildhall, replicates the physical layout of a church organ to ensure practice can be meaningful for students.



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YOUNG MUSICIAN OF THE YEAR

The Young Musician of the Year competition takes place every November. Girls are entered via their teachers: if their teacher is outside of school they can collect a form from Mrs Brown to be signed by their teacher.

There are four adjudicators (Strings, Piano, Wind, Brass & Percussion and Singing) who judge classes in the morning, and the winners of the morning classes go through to the afternoon final. All four adjudicators judge the afternoon final, awarding a Junior and Senior Young Musician, and an additional piano prize.

All girls in U2 and above can take part that meet the minimum entry standard.

HOUSE MUSIC

The annual House Music competition is a real highlight. The whole school takes part, and each house demonstrates bravery in their choice of music and their diligence in the preparation for the day. A visiting adjudicator attends to select winners for each category and the overall winning house.

ALEXANDER TECHNIQUE WORKSHOPS

Judith Kleinman from the Royal College of Music leads our workshops over the year. These are open to any girl Years 7 and above.

There are many good reasons to introduce Alexander's work to children and teenagers. Articles in the media increasingly report that young people are experiencing more backache, discomfort, stress and anxiety. Whereas education is often geared towards goal-setting and exams, Alexander lessons help young people to take a step back, find resources within themselves, and stay in touch with their well-being.

Much of what we regard as talent is actually co-ordination in the widest sense: intelligent co-ordination of mind, body and emotions. As children come into contact through lessons with the source of their mind-body co-ordination; they find their overall learning improves. They become more confident and resilient, able to think calmly and constructively when faced with life's challenges.

The Technique helps children achieve their goals with less effort. The awareness developed in Alexander lessons can be used in music, academic learning, physical pursuits like sports and dance, as well as playing computer games and everyday living. Children quickly get interested in Alexander work when they see their skills and confidence improving. This practical approach allows them to feel in charge of their reactions to life and to have more choice.

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MUSIC SCHOLARS OUR EXPECTATIONS OF YOU

EXTRA-CURRICULAR COMMITMENT

As Music Scholars and Award Holders we expect a full commitment to the musical life of the school. We expect you to take part in a number of activities including the orchestra and choir. Regular attendance is essential as you give an important example to the other girls.

PERFORMANCE

We expect you to perform at the Scholars' Concert and additionally Open Days and the Open Evening in June/July and at other events as required.

We would also expect you to play during Assemblies on occasion and to help with the organisation of Assemblies and small ensembles. Those of you who hold Awards from Livery Companies may well be asked to perform for them.

School life is very busy and we do understand girls can have many commitments. Any performance opportunities will have plenty of notice but some can be last-minute opportunities. We hope you will endeavour to take advantage of opportunities to perform as much as possible.

GCSE AND A-LEVEL MUSIC

We do hope you will seriously consider taking GCSE/A-level Music as it presents a wonderful opportunity to develop your musicianship that rarely exists during or outside of the school week. Both give the opportunity for you to work with your peers and explore music history and develop compositional skills.

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT FROM US

You can expect a commitment from the department to help further your musical development by ensuring you have the right opportunities to develop in a way that balances your musical and academic life. Through close monitoring we hope you will feel an important part of the department and the school as a whole.

The Music Department will conduct a brief yearly review of all its scholars to assess progress and to reward commitment. We will do all we can to support those who may have some difficulties. In very rare circumstances it might be necessary for Scholarships/ Awards to be withdrawn if the holders are not fulfilling their responsibilities.

Music Scholarships are offered at 11+ and 16+ entry. Please contact the Director of Music for more information.

PREP MUSIC OPPORTUNITIES

Girls in the Prep Department are immersed in musicmaking during their time at City. They have weekly choir and orchestra (for girls of an appropriate standard), and we offer instrumental lessons but not singing lessons (which are available when in the Senior School). There are a range of challenges, including double bass and music theory, and there are opportunities to perform as a soloist and as a class in and out of music classes

The annual 'Prep Opera' is a real highlight, and ir the summer of 2017 'Olivia' was performed at Bridewell Theatre.





MUSICAL LIVES BEYOND CITY

Many girls have left City to pursue musical careers.

Soprano Raphaela Papadakis attended CLSG beginning her full time operatic training at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama, after graduating from Clare College, Cambridge University, with a first class degree in English Literature.
